- Grantee of Foreign Trade Zone #205 convenient on-dock customs clearance.


Ro-Ro Experts

- The Port of Hueneme is a vital link in the automotive industry supply chain and has experienced consistent growth since the first vehicles arrived in 1977.
- The Port of Hueneme consistently ranks among the top 10 U.S. ports for the import and export of automobiles and other rolling stock.
- The Port of Hueneme handles over 5% of all U.S. car volume and 13.4% of all West Coast Ro-Ro tonnage.
- Over 60% of Port revenue and 23% of cargo is autos.
- A full-service auto port with highly skilled and motivated teams focused on unique customer requirements, maximum productivity and damage risk reduction.

- The Port handles over 26,750 autos per month.
- Autos typically move to a processor in 3 days or less.
- The Port offers dedicated Ro-Ro terminal, 6 deep water berths, and 8,000 parking bays, adjacent to 3 auto processors who have handled as many as 321,000 autos, with capacity to meet increasing demands.
- Approximately 34 acres of on-dock and near-dock terminal land available at The Port, with over 165 additional acres at nearby distribution facilities.

Easy Intermodal Access

- Near dock access to Ventura County Railroad (VCRR), a local short rail system with the highest safety ratings, is operated by Genessee & Wyoming. VCRR is an integral corridor for the movement of autos through The Port and its processing facilities interchanging with Union Pacific Railroad, providing an important intermodal link throughout North America.
- · Uncongested waterways, docks and transportation corridors result in efficiency and high velocity.
- The Port Intermodal Corridor provides easy access to major California transportation routes, U.S. Highway 101 and Interstate 5 generating faster time to market.

World Class Vehicle Processing Facilities

Three nearby vehicle distribution companies perform pre-delivery inspection, technical service and coordinate inland transportation to regional dealerships.

- BMW of North America is a 24-acre BMWowned facility operated by AMPORTS. The 100,100 SF vehicle processing building includes office space, full mechanical, body repair and wash services.
- GLOVIS leases 80+ acres on Naval Base Ventura County, adjacent to The Port. The 109,000 SF facility includes PDI/ accessory, warranty, paint and body, wash and parts inventory.
- · Wallenius Wilhelmsen Logistics Americas (WWL) owns a 50,400 SF facility with a 19,600 SF body shop, 13,000 SF of office space, and 8,500 SF wash facilities.
